- Directors Marie Chuang, representing San Mateo County-Central Cities, and Directors David Canepa and Ray Mueller, representing the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors, were sworn in as new members of the Board.
- The Directors and executive staff expressed their appreciation for Director Pine's service on the Board.
- April Chan, General Manager/CEO, welcomed the new directors. She said that the only
 major impact on the District from the December 31 storm was at the Linda Mar Park N Ride,
 where the parking lot was flooded and notification was sent out. She reported that in
 addition, the Operations team was instrumental in helping to move residents from a
 flooded mobile home park. Ms. Chan said that Grace Martinez, Acting Chief Financial
 Officer, was leaving the District and Kathleen Kelly would be acting as Interim Chief
 Financial Officer.
- Chelsea Schultz, Planning Administrator, provided a presentation on MTC (Metropolitan Transportation Commission) regional coordination and Shruti Hari of the MTC fielded a discussion with the directors.
- Legal Counsel Joan Cassman and Shayna van Hoften provided a review of new Brown Act Meeting Exceptions and Potential Legislative Positions Related to Remote Meeting Exceptions for Board consideration and input.

Legislative Committee

Adoption of 2023 Legislative Program

Finance Committee

Award of Contract for Microtransit Services

Millie Tolleson, Acting Director of Planning, introduced Kate Christopherson, Senior Planner, who provided the presentation. Kevin Yin, Director, Contracts and Procurement, provided a background on the contract. Chair Josh Powell asked why the project was able to move so quickly. Ms. Christopherson said they are getting staff ready and will be able to initiate service in June. Chair Powell asked if it was a pilot program, and Ms. Christopherson said it was a full implementation. Committee Chair Marina Fraser said the program would be of great benefit to Coastside residents. Director Peter Ratto asked if the vehicles were fully ADA-compliant. Ms.

Christopherson said not all of them were, but there would be ADA-compliant vehicles would be available in each location.
