

Active 101 US 101 San Mateo County Crossings Improvement Plan


FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Active Transportation?

Active transportation refers to human-powered mobility, such as biking, walking or rolling. By improving active transportation infrastructure, the San Mateo County Transportation Authority (TA) is striving to help create vibrant communities that provide safe, comfortable, convenient, reliable, efficient, and affordable ways for people to get around.

What projects are being considered for Active 101?

The TA will focus on reviewing previously identified projects from local cities, San Mateo County, MTC, and Caltrans plans that may enhance active transportation conditions within a quarter mile of US 101. These projects may include new bike and pedestrian bridges, bike paths and lanes, and intersection improvements, such as high visibility crosswalks and curb extensions, as shown in the image below.



How will projects be evaluated?

The community will have the opportunity to review a list of projects along the US 101 corridor and provide feedback on which projects should advance to the preliminary design phase. Community and stakeholder feedback will be included as part of the evaluation framework, which also includes project cost, construction time, safety and the potential to increase access for underserved communities.

What projects move forward to preliminary design?

Based on the evaluation framework and community and stakeholder feedback received during the first phase of the project, up to 10 projects will be selected to advance to preliminary design. The preliminary designs will then be taken back out to the public to ensure that the proposed changes meet the needs of the community. At least one project from North, Mid, and South county will be selected to move forward to preliminary design.

What Projects will be included in the final plan?

Ultimately, the preliminary designs will be updated based on community and stakeholder feedback and each project will be included in the final Active 101 Plan. An implementation strategy will be developed for each priority project that assesses feasibility, costs, potential impacts, and applicable funding opportunities. These projects will also be added as priority projects to the 101 Corridor Connect North, Mid, or South County Multimodal Strategies, which are currently in development.
