



EXPRESS LANES PROJECT THE PURPOSE





Jobs, housing and population growth continues

2010-2040 projections:

- Bay Area:
 - 1.3 Million new jobs
 - 820,000 new housing units
- San Mateo:
 - 134,000 new jobs
 - 60,000 new housing units

No incentive to share a ride

Cars avoid the freeway

The capacity increasing Caltrain Electrification Project

Multiple projects working to solve the problem

New regional express bus service on the 101 corridor

Santa Clara County Express Lanes on 101 seamlessly connecting to San Mateo 101 Express Lanes

Planning underway to extend the new 101 Express Lanes to the San Francisco County Line

Increased park-and-ride lots, and improvements to existing lots

Cities and Counties are working to improve and incentivize ridesharing and public transit use

EXPRESS LANES PROJECT EXPRESS LANE DEFINITIONS



General Purpose Lane: a regular highway lane.

Carpool Lane/High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) Lane: a highway lane that can only be used when there is more than one person in the car. Some Carpool/HOV lanes require 2 people and others require 3 people.

Express Lane: a highway lane which buses, carpools, and motorcycles access for free. Other vehicles, like cars with just one person, pay a toll that goes up or down depending on how crowded the lane is.







EXPRESS LANES PROJECT TOLL POLICY



- The SMCEL-JPA Board will establish tolling rules and policies through the adoption of a toll ordinance in the Summer 2021.
- The toll ordinance will include:
 - Pricing
 - Discounts
 - Enforcement

Equity Program Study

- Develop a Pilot Equity Program that invests toll revenue in historically underserved communities in San Mateo County
- The Program should be flexible and can evolve over time in response to changing community needs
- Funding:
 - \$1 Million available in first year
 - \$600,000 annually in subsequent years



Desired Outcomes



Flexible and adaptive to changing needs and feedback.



Encourage mode shift to high-occupancy modes.



Strategies benefit underserved communities who live near or use the lanes.



Supports the Express Lanes benefits and goals (mobility, travel time, and reliability).



Program reflects input from historically disadvantaged communities.



Improve active transportation network adjacent to the corridor.




Strategies are replicable and could be expanded regionally.

SAN MATEO 101 **EXPRESS LANES PROJECT EQUITY PROGRAM STUDY**



15 Studied Targeted Geographies





Identifying Barriers to Travel



Do not own or have access to a car for regular use



Limited access to the internet and/or a smart phone



Do not have access to a credit card or bank account



Have a disability that makes traveling by transit difficult or impossible



Congestion on US-101 limits access to job opportunities



Feel unsafe walking or biking on streets close to US-101



Phase 1 Community Engagement

Key takeaways

Mobility challenges facing communities:

- Unreliable public transportation
- Cost of transportation
- Too much traffic

Equity program recommendations:

- Toll subsidies or other programs to help low-income drivers use the lanes
- More frequent and reliable public transportation
- Improved sidewalk and bicycle infrastructure
- Discounted or free transit passes
- Any program for individual benefits should be relatively easy to access

Alternative #1: Express Lane Toll Benefit

Pre-loaded \$50 Toll Tags

- Provide one-time benefit of preloaded toll tags to qualifying households
- \$50 cash benefit plus security deposit
- Toll tags can be reloaded online (with a credit or debit card), by mail, or at cash payment locations
- 7,000+ households could be served annually

Alternative #2: Transit Benefit

\$50 Cash-On-Clipper Benefit

- Provide \$50 per year to eligible individuals as cash value on a Clipper Card for use on any regional transit service that accepts payment via Clipper
- 10,000 individuals could be served annually





Alternative #3: Place-Based Improvements

Biking, Walking, & Transit Safety Improvements

- Build safety improvements in historically disadvantaged communities in San Mateo County on the 101 Corridor
- Example projects:
 - Bike lanes, ADA ramps, new/modified traffic signals, bus shelters, intersection improvements
- Communities could apply for the funding





Alternative #4: Carpool Rewards Program

Cash Benefit for Carpool Trips

- Provide carpool cash benefit up to \$50 per year for qualifying individuals
- Both drivers and passengers eligible
- 10,000+ individuals could be served annually





Next Steps

Selection of a Preferred Alternative

- Analyze the four alternatives
- Solicit community and stakeholder input
- Select and recommend preferred alternative to JPA Board
- JPA Board adoption: May 2021
- Develop implementation plan
